  - o Mark Stein stated that the 1-hour CLEs during covid were lucrative, and we should push for more of them.
- CLE newsletter send Tracey links to put in newsletter
  - We can use this to promote after-market CLE sales
- Michelle Suarez- suggests potential CLE on how bill becomes a law and suggested a CLE on statutory updates.

- Business litigation committee second vice chair is in charge of CLE programs. Committee is considering a case law update CLE in late spring/ early summer, and a Fall CLE on restrictive covenants.
  - Judge Delano suggests CLEs on evidence issues, and Utibe Ikpe suggests CLEs on discovery.
- Andrew Layden announces that blockchain taskforce is putting on CLE tomorrow at 1:30pm. The CLE is supposed to be an introduction to blockchain. Tracey is going to recommend that it be recorded, so it goes on the BLS webpage.
- Andrew poses question of whether we need anything from leadership, and nobody had suggestions or comments on the topic
- Luis Rivera asks what type of articles are needed for the BLS journal.
  - O Andrew Layden thinks articles can be reused, but not sure, so he will be looking into
