Roland Sanchez-Medina, candidate for President-Elect of the Florida Bar, addressed the Section and gave his campaign position and credentials.

Chair Donlon took Jorge Piedra, Board of Governors liaison to the Section, out of order and Mr. Piedra stated that the Board of Governors remains committed to helping the Section and asked Section members to reach out if there is anything the Board of Governors can do to assist the Section to accomplish its projects.

III. Approval of Minutes from January 27, 2022 Midyear Executive Council Meeting (Exhibit B)

Secretary Farach presented the Minutes from the January 27, 2022, Midyear Meeting of the Executive Council of the Section. There being no comments from the Section, Secretary Farach moved the Minutes be approved. The motion was seconded by Peter Valori and, upon vote taken, carried unanimously.

IV. Treasurer’s Report (Exhibit C – Recent Financials)

Chair Donlon began by bestowing a Special Recognition Award to Judge Laurel Isicoff for her unwavering support over many years in championing financial literacy and helping the Section get its financial literacy legislation over the finish line. Judge Isicoff thanked the Section's excellent lobbying staff, Judge Brown, the other judges, and all those who helped and stated: "I was just one of many, thank you very much for the award."

Chair Donlon then presented Andy Layden with the Section's Recognition of Unwavering Service to the Business Law Section Award. Chair Donlon noted that Mr. Layden exemplifies so many great aspects of the Section by being a great person, a great lawyer, and one who is always willing to help on any assigned task.

And certainly not least, Chair Donlon bestowed the Section's Member of the Year award on Stephanie Lieb for her extraordinary work chairing the Legislation Committee, and addressing the Section's proposed financial literacy legislation. Ms. Lieb went above and beyond in dealing with her work, in making sure the Section received the positive press coverage it deserved, and never letting the difficult parts of the process faze her.

Finally, Chair Donlon gave special recognition to former Section Chair Jim Murphy for attending the meeting via Zoom even though he was on vacation in France.

VII. Reports of Committees With Motions or Needing to be Taken Out of Order

A. Legislation Committee

Chair Lieb reported that the Legislation Committee had a successful legislative year thanks in large part to legislative consultants Aimee Diaz Lyon and Doug Bell. The Committee fielded six proactive pieces of legislation and “3.5” passed: Financial Literacy, U.C.C. Pick Your Partner, Service of Process, and ½ of the “Kearney Fix” which is under contemplation by the Governor. Initiatives that did not pass were the Judgment Lien and Chapter 517 legislation. The Committee expects next year’s initiatives to include Judgment Liens, UCRERA, Warehouse Liens, Chapter 517, Restrictive Covenants, and Settlement Agreements.

Chair Lieb further reported that the Section’s substantive committees have reviewed the Section’s legislative positions and have approved same. Chair Lieb moved the adoption of the Section’s legislative positions by way of triple motion, which was seconded by Peter Valori. Upon vote taken, subject to all judges in attendance abstaining, the motion carried with all other members present voting in favor.

Chair Lieb then took up the matter of the legislative consultants contract with the law firm of Metz, Husband and Daughton, P.A. as found at **Exhibit F** of the Agenda, and moved the adoption of the contract. The motion was seconded by Peter Valori. Upon vote taken, subject to all judges in attendance abstaining, the motion carried with all other members present voting in favor

B. Inclusion, Mentoring & Fellowship Committee

Chair Taylor reported the Committee continues to work on the Mentorship Program and that Section members will continue to receive reminders to sign up to be a mentor or a mentee. Turning to the issue of the Section’s Diversity CLE Policy, Chair Taylor moved that the Business Law Section approve the proposed revised CLE Diversity Equity and Inclusion CLE Policy attached hereto as **Exhibit D**, which motion was seconded by Leyza Blanco. Upon vote taken, subject to all judges in attendance abstaining, the motion carried with all other members present voting in favor. Chair Taylor thanked Marianne Dorris for her work on this project.

C. Blockchain and Cryptocurrency Task Force

Chair Pollack stated that the Task Force has been working on upcoming seminars focused on Tokenization and NFTs and that it is engaged in discussions regarding proposed U.C.C. Article 12 dealing with digital assets. Chair Pollack then moved that the Task Force be converted to a standing committee of the Section and renamed the Blockchain & Digital Assets Committee. Chair Pollack pointed out that the supporting White Paper for the motion was attached to the Agenda as **Exhibit E**. Jim Moon requested a friendly amendment to re-state the motion such that the proposed committee be designated as a

substantive committee, rather than a standing committee. Chair Pollack accepted the modification. The motion, as so modified, was seconded by Dan Davis. Upon vote taken, the motion carried unanimously.

D. Chapter 517 Task Force

VIII. Reports of Substantive Law Committees

A. Bankruptcy/UCC

Chair James Moon reported that the Committee discussed and voted upon the sunset of certain legislative positions. Office of Financial Regulation Commissioner Weigel attended the meeting and has been proactive regarding legislation on Article XII of the UCC. Chair Moon then made a triple motion to adopt the proposed revisions to the Assignment for Benefit of Creditors statute, specially recognizing the work of ABC Task Force Co-Chairs Trish Redmond and Jodi Dubose and or Reporter Nicole McLemore. Chair Moon also recognized Judge Catherine McEwen, noting that she was stepping down as Judicial Liaison of Bankruptcy UCC, after having served in that role for the past sixteen years. Judge Mindy Mora has agreed to step into the role, and was welcomed by the Council

B. Business Litigation

Chair Allison Leonard reported that Business Litigation created a committee to study possible legislation regarding settlement agreements. Chair Leonard further reported that Chris DeCort has organized a Case Law Update seminar and that the Committee is assisting with the production of the first Legislative Update the Friday of the Labor Day Retreat.

C. Computer Law & Technology

Chair Eli Mattern reported the Computer Law Committee had a good meeting where it reviewed the Section's legislative positions, particularly those identified to the Committee. The Committee then engaged in a discussion regarding and voted to recommend the Blockchain & Digital Assets Task Force be converted to be a substantive committee of the Section and solicited help in putting together a White Paper in support of the change.

D. Corporations, Securities & Financial Services

The Committee Report was given by Vice-Chair Michelle Suarez who reported the Committee is planning a seminar on Regulations D and A in September. Vice-Chair Suarez then recognized the article that Daniel H. Aronson, Stuart R. Cohn, and she wrote for the Florida Bar Journal discussing the differences between forming business entities in Florida as opposed to Delaware. The Committee also discussed and voted on approval of its legislative positions. Mr. Conti then moved for the Section to create a Chapter 517 Task

Force, which motion was seconded by Valeria Angelucci. Upon vote taken, the motion passed unanimously. Vice-Chair then moved for the creation of a Chapter 517 Task Force, which motion was seconded by Alan Howard. Upon vote taken, the motion passed unanimously.

E. E-Discovery & Digital Evidence Committee

Chair Sara Paris reported that the Committee was slated to present a four hour seminar the following day and that Steve Teppler would be discussing cybersecurity as a part of that seminar. In addition, the Committee is coordinating with the Civil Rules Task Force on the e-discovery issues in the proposed changes to the Civil Rules.

F. Intellectual Property Law

Chair Michele Moss reported that the Committee discussed and voted on legislative positions and also discussed and voted in favor of transforming the Blockchain Task Force into a substantive committee of the Section. Chair Moss also gave a recap of the successful I.P. Symposium. The Committee is also looking for help from the Fellows to update the I.P. Certification materials, and the Committee will also be updating its policies and procedures. Chair Moss then gave an update on the amicus brief prepared by the Amicus Committee concerning state and federal jurisdiction over I.P. disputes and further stated the Committee will be presenting a CLE on NFTs and the First Sale Doctrine.

IX. Reports of Standing Committees and Task Forces

A. Antitrust and Trade Regulation Subcommittee

Committee Judicial Chair Ed LaRose gave the Committee report and stated the Committee discussed the certification exam at the meeting. Judicial Chair LaRose further reported that the Committee also discussed the fact that the Federal Trade Commission is investigating the possibility of monitoring non-compete clauses in employment contracts.

B. Bankruptcy Judicial Liaison Committee

Chair Jodi Dubose reported the Committee had great updates from all three judicial districts and that Judges Grossman and Brown presented an interesting seminar on the status of the *Barton* Doctrine in bankruptcy courts. She reported that best of all, the Committee had a great dinner with a robust cocktail hour and still had time to watch the Tampa Bay Lightning game.

C. Chapter 607 Sub-Committee

Co-Chair Gary Teblum reported there was no update to the work of the Committee.

D. CLE Committee

Chair Andrew Layden stated the Committee asked that the substantive committees send representatives to the CLE Committee meetings and expressed appreciation that most were able to do so. The main focus of the Committee will be to obtain articles for publication in the Florida Bar Journal and to help in putting together CLEs for the other committees and task forces.

E. Communications Committee

Chair Crystal Potts asked all substantive committees to check their web pages to make sure the information on the respective page is current, to assign liaisons to the Committee, and to help produce articles for publication on the website. Chair Potts also reported the Committee will begin producing video interviews with judges and will start spotlighting select members of the Section.

Section Chair Donlon took this opportunity to recognize Paul Perdomo and Tracey Eller for their work on behalf of the Section. The Council demonstrated its appreciation of their work with a hearty round of applause.

F. COVID-19 Pandemic Recovery Task Force

Co-Chair Bart Valdes reported that the focus of the Task Force has changed as Florida lawyers are now faced with new issues as they head back to court, both digitally and in person. As a result, the Task Force will now turn its attention to whether the Florida Rules of General Practice and Judicial Administration should be amended to reflect this new reality. The Task Force will continue to examine this issue and will try to rebrand by the Labor Day Retreat as the Practice and Procedures Task Force.

G. Financial Literacy Task Force

Chair Carlos Sardi reported that the Task Force celebrated the passage of the Dorothy Hukill Financial Literacy legislation for which the Section received great press coverage, and that the Veteran's Financial Literacy Program is going nationwide through the American Bankruptcy Institute. The Task Force seeks to continue the forward progress and to have April declared Financial Literacy Month. The Task Force also discussed a possible CLE addressing Financial Literacy for Professionals, which CLE will be produced in conjunction with the FICPA and is expected to roll out in Fall 2022. Chair Sardi made a motion to have the Section contribute \$5,000 to continue the Task Force's work on financial literacy, which motion was seconded by Robert Kain. Upon vote taken, the motion carried unanimously.

H. Health & Wellness Task Force

Chair Dineen Wasylik reported the Task Force has enjoyed great social media programming and that Carlos Sardi is writing an article on financial stress. Chair Wasylik also reported that Brian Cuban gave a great talk on lawyers and addiction at the Section luncheon. The Task Force is additionally creating a mental health CLE.

I. Labor Day Retreat Committee

Chair-Elect Doug Bates gave the report of the Committee and reminded the Council that the Retreat will be held this year at the JW Marriott at Marco Island. Chair-Elect Bates states he has visited the site and it will be a great event. He continued and stated sponsorship is big part of the Retreat and then took a moment to thank the sponsors. Chair-Elect Bates stated the room block will open soon but members will have to register for the Retreat before being given room block information.

J. Marketing, Promotions & Sponsorship Committee

Chair Jacqui Calderin stated the Committee had a great year both raising sponsorship dollars as well as re-assessing the needs of the Section. As a result of its review, the Committee raised sponsorship levels 10% across the board and created the Legacy Level, a new level of sponsorship for sponsors who have been Diamond level for 5 years. Chair Calderin further reported that the Section now has \$237,000 committed as of this point but has a hard deadline of July 10 for getting all sponsorships committed. Finally, Chair Calderin recognized Matt Hale for his tremendous work on the Committee.

K. Membership Committee

Chair Dana Robbins reported a reformatting of the Scholars program, noting that revised applications are expected to be out soon. She stated that the Committee will be exploring the possibility of a Happy Hour with past Fellows to be held at the Labor Day Retreat. This year, the Committee is looking to host 20 scholars at a cost of \$750 each for a total cost of \$15,000. There are funds in the IMF budget for this purpose but Ms. Blanco stated the Section can't waive registration fees. Mr. Sardi stated costs have in the past been shared between the IMF and Fellows Committees but Chair Donlon reminded the Council that committees typically don't have a budget. In response, Ms. Blanco suggested that Scholarship/Fellowship have their own line item in the annual budget. Treasurer Stein noted there remains \$60,000 in the budget Scholarship so there is money available for the program if the Council chose to proceed. Chair-Elect Bates said Florida Bar rules prohibit the changing of the budget once it is approved so the resolution will have to be handled the Retreat Committee, the Treasurer, and the Chair. Accordingly, Chair Robbins tabled the Motion to allow further discussion as to the best way to proceed.

L. Opinion Standards Committee

Chair Robert Barron reported the Committee had a great meeting and will continue working on further potential revisions to the Third Party Legal Opinions Report.

M. Pro Bono Task Force & Pro Bono Committee

Chair Amanda Finley stated the Section's pro bono program is now effectively on-line and mentioned that the Committee expects to be presenting an annual Pro Bono award.

N. Scholar and Fellows Retention Task Force

Vice-Chair John Dorris reported the Task Force met yesterday and all Fellows were in attendance. The Task Force will continue its efforts to re-engage prior Fellows.

O. Series LLC Task Force

Gary Teblum reported that the Task Force had a great meeting and is still trying very hard to make the Series LLC legislation a 2023 project.

P. Chapter 542 Task Force

Chair Brian Barakat reported that the Task Force previously drafted a rewrite of Chapter 542 but noted that the draft was not accepted by the Florida House of Representatives. He explained that, given this challenge, the Task Force has taken no further action. Chair Barakat also stated the Task Force will be reviewing the need for continuing its work in light of President Biden's creation of a competition committee and the related instruction the President has given to the FTC to investigate restrictive covenants.

Q. Uniform Commercial Real Estate Receivership Act (UCRERA)

Task Force Chair Amanda Fernandez reminded the Executive Council that the Act passed in 2020 but noted that the Committee is aware the Real Property, Probate, and Trust Law Section (RPPTL) is proposing changes. Judge Mora and Mark Wolfson have worked extensively on possible revisions to the RPPTL proposal and have tried to clean up certain items such as setting the right of redemption at the greater of the amount owed or the contract amount. Judge Mora is planning to meet with the RPPTL Section on July 22nd and will come back to the Task Force and the Council after that with further comments and suggestions. Jamie Marx offered to help with the process.

R. Uniform Voidable Transfers Act (UVTA) Task Force

Task Force Chair John Hutton stated the Task Force will reconvene in 2024 to consider whether to restart the process to get legislation passed.

S. Business Courts Task Force

No report

T. Civil Rules Task Force

Chair Russell Landy stated that after securing approval from the Big Bar, the Task Force filed its response to the changes proposed by Florida Supreme Court Workgroup on Improved Resolution of Civil Cases in May 2022. Chair Landy further pointed out the work of the Task Force was greatly aided by Jim Murphy and Ralph Artiglierre. The Workgroup has received an extension until September 20 to address comments, and the Workgroup plans to issue its report for proposed rule changes shortly thereafter.

U. IOTA Task Force

Chair John McDonald stated the Task Force has finished its work and will be disbanded.
