BDA Committee Report to EC January 29, 2026

The Blockchain and Digital Assets (BDA) Committee had 6 Committee meetings since the Labor Day meeting in light of the FLORIDA'S PROPOSED PAYMENT STABLECOIN ACT (Robert Brighton, Stablecoin Task Force leader) and the 15 AI bills, 4 Committee meetings (Robert Kain, AI Task Force leader) .

At the Winter Meeting, the BDA Committee had 11 attendees. The Committee discussed and voted on the following BDA Legislative Policy. The Committee APPROVED:

“Supports legislation relating to virtual currencies and other digital assets that have an economic value, including, without limitation, blockchain tokens or coins (including fungible and non-fungible tokens, and utility, security, asset-backed, and governance tokens and stablecoins) (collectively “digital assets”), digital asset wallets, and service providers that sell, maintain and effect the transfer of such digital assets, in such a manner as to encourage innovation consistent with federal law and similar state laws, without tying any statutory definition to a specific implementation of the digital asset technology, and balancing economic growth, industry concerns, and consumer protection for Floridians.”
